

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR AUTHOR

‘Proceedings of the Haryana History Congress’ is a bilingual annual peer-reviewed journal that publishes research papers on the various aspects of the history and culture of Haryana. The research papers should be original, not submitted to any other journal, and not previously published.

Format of the Manuscripts

- * The author/s should mention title of the research paper along with the name/s, designation with Institute, postal and e-mail address and mobile number.
- * Research paper should be submitted in MS-Word format (doc/docx, with pdf file).
- * The abstract should not exceed more than 200 words, along with 7-10 keywords.
- * The paper's length should be between 4000-5000 words, excluding notes and references.
- * **For English-** Times New Roman font with a paper title size of 16, subtitle 14, and main content of 12. **For Hindi-** use Kruti Dev 10 font style with a paper title size of 20, subtitle 18, and main content of 16. The line spacing should be kept at 1.5.
- * Each table should be cited in the text. The title of the table should be on top (with courtesy, if any).
- * Each figure and plate must be cited in text as Fig. 1 and include a caption below (with courtesy, if any).

Notes & References

- * Citations for all the references should be provided in the research paper in Chicago Manual Citation Style: 16th Edition.
- * Notes and References should be consecutively numbered and presented at the end of the paper.
